

Skating On Skis



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Sidecut: Most skating skis have no sidecut (the long, inward side curves), since it makes them more difficult to set on edge and control when skating. Sidecut is designated by the widths, in millimeters, of the ski's tip, waist and tail (listed as 44/43/43, for example, on product specs).

Remember, this is NOT how to ski, but only a drill to help you feel a concept and master a primary principle of uphill skate skiing. Try this: while standing still, rock back and forth between your feet completely transferring your weight from ski to ski while keeping your legs bent.
